President's Report July 2019

I am pleased to be able to report that we continue to receive positive feedback about the work AMPI is undertaking.

Membership is growing and AMPI's credibility across the industry has significantly improved. This is largely a result of the high standard of the Workshops and Conferences we host. These Conferences continue to deliver quality speakers on relevant topics, identify world best practice, and facilitate debate on some topical issues; enabling Pilots, Ports and Service Providers to continue to improve the services they provide. Our Conferences are also an excellent opportunity for a broad cross section of Businesses, Service Providers, Stakeholders and Regulators to meet and build valuable relationships. I like to call it "Industry Resource Management"!

The AMPI Conference Committee has been preparing for the Sydney Conference for over 18 months and must be congratulated for the world-class event that is emerging.
